### CALCULATION!

### CENTRAL GRAD A PIONEER

Word was received that **Frederick Gale Shuman Central '37** had passed away. At Central he won first place in the Indiana Comprehensive Mathematics competition. and went on to Ball State University graduating in 1941. Commissioned in the Army Air Corp he went to MIT for a masters degree in meteorology. He earned his Doctorate from MIT in 1951. He served as a weather officer in North Africa and Italy during WWII. He then began a long career in weather forecasting and continued to do research until 1990 advancing to the position of director of the National Meteorological Center. The director of the National Weather Services said 'he would be remembered as a true pioneer in the development of operational numerical weather prediction. He lived with his wife **Helen Fragomeni Schuman, Central '45** and family in the Washington area. Both his mother and father worked at the Studebaker plant in South Bend for a time; his father as a pattern


Robert Miller

Dame men's basketball team for twenty years. His teams won 393 games and advanced to the NCAA tournament 14 times. More important than the on-court victories all 56 of his players who completed four years of eligibility received their degrees. Following his retirement as the head coach he served President George Bush addressing drug misuse, education and poverty. He served as a delegate in Africa as a member of a United National observer team. He has authored two books, has initiated and served a local program to save schools and promote learning in our public schools and in recent years has served as an analyst on ESPN basketball. Judd Leighton was born in South Bend in 1911 and is a 1930 graduate of Central High School where he was a very active student. He was elected Senior Class President and captained the Golf team...he later was South Bend City Champion. After Central he went on to the Northwestern University in Evanston for his undergraduate work. He then served his country in the U.S. Navy and returned to Northwestern for his law degree after the war. In 1947 he clerked for a law firm in Washington D.C.. He returned to South Bend and entered the banking business. He and his wife, Mary Morris Leighton were patrons of the arts and extremely generous supporting charities and community needs. Several South Bend edifices bear The Leighton and Morris names.


### South Bend Central Remembered
